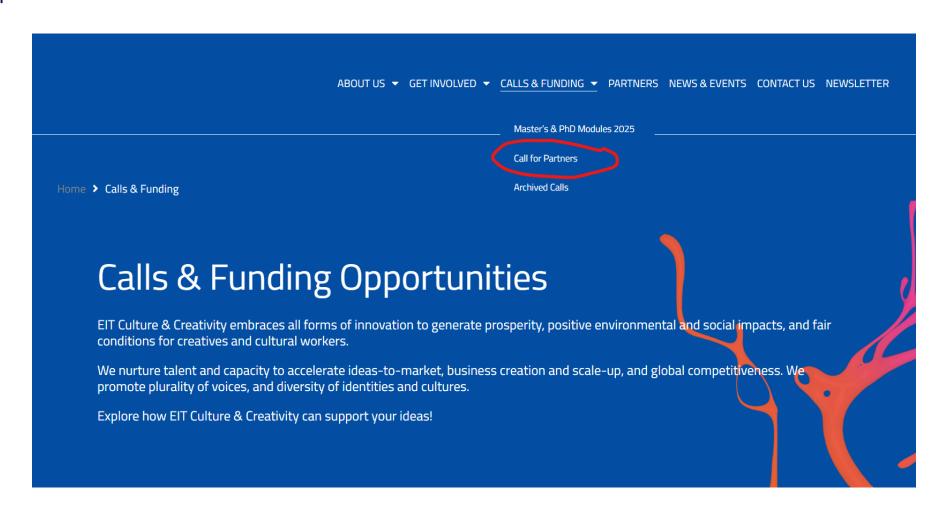

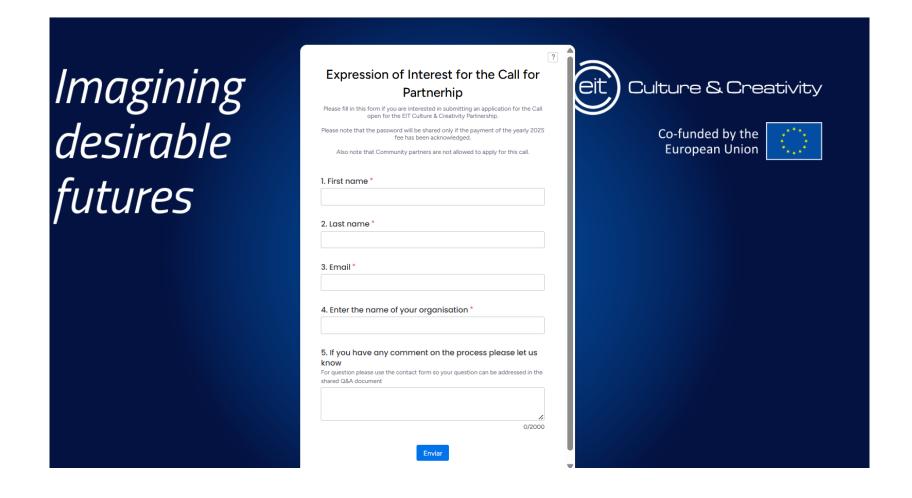

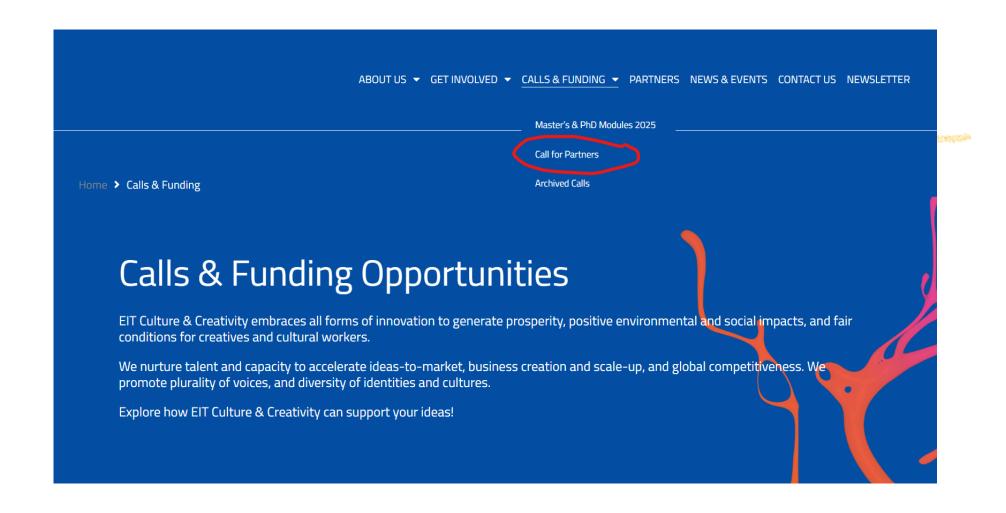

Application form

Who can apply?

Lead organisations must hold **valid Core or Cooperation Partner status for 2025** and must have paid their membership fees by the time of application. Each consortium must comprise at least two partners with valid membership and demonstrate **integration of the Extended Knowledge Triangle**—encompassing education, research, business, cultural institutions, and public and civil-society stakeholders.

How to apply:

- Read the full call guidelines and check eligibility
- Express your interest in participating in the Call here (the password will be provided to you if your membership status is valid).
- Submit your application via the **EIT Culture & Creativity platform, here.**

To be considered eligible, **proposals must be submitted in English** via the designated online platform no later than the deadline and must include all required documentation, such as the **completed application form**, **curriculum vitae of key experts**, and a **detailed budget plan in Excel format**. Applicants must also have a valid Participant Identification Code (PIC) through the EU Funding & Tenders Portal.



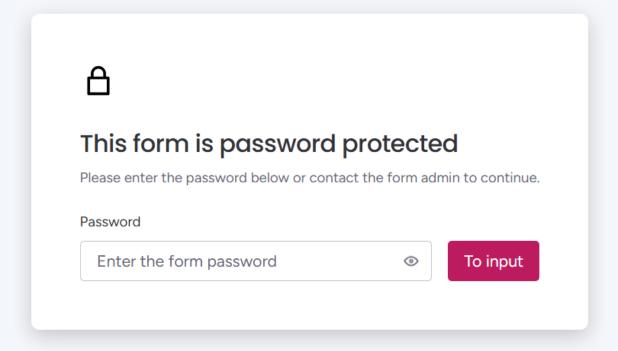

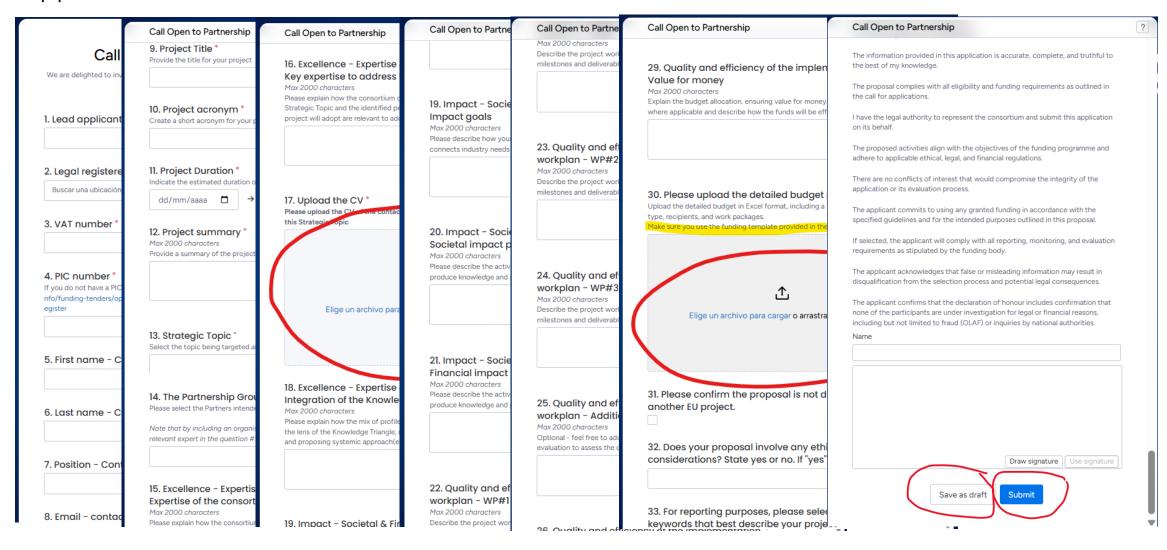

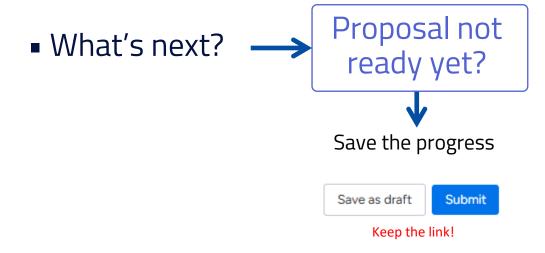

- Advancing circular design and biobased architecture education
- Promoting trans-sector collaboration for urban cohesion
- Enabling SMEs and emerging professionals to scale through entrepreneurial and innovationdriven models

Audiovisual

- Deliver future-oriented training on AI, data, cloud, and IP protection
- Foster trans-sector design of responsible storytelling formats and business models
- Boost competitiveness of European AVM SMEs by addressing analytics and monetisation

Policy development and strategic positioning

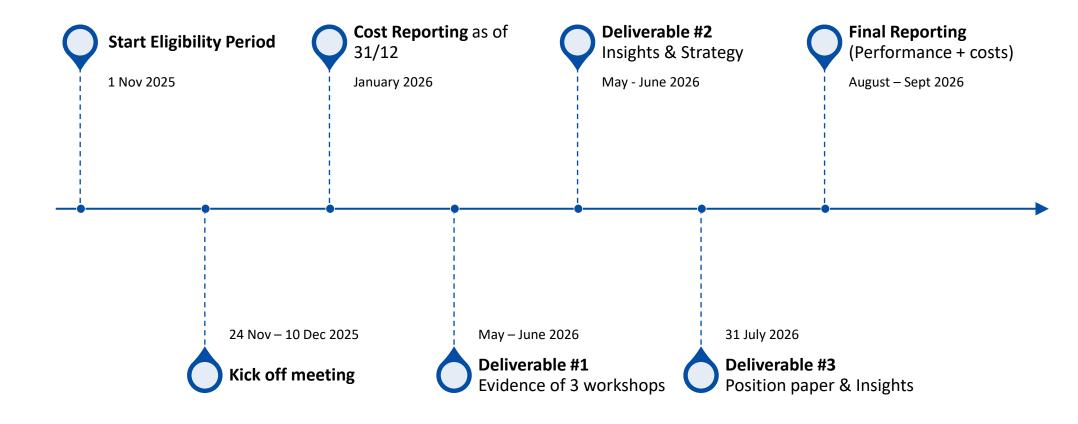
- Develop tools and methods to gather actionable knowledge on policy actions

7 Evaluation criteria





1. Expertise, state-of-theart knowledge & EIT framework understanding

- Methods and tools that are relevant for EIT Culture & Creativity, with a strong potential to generate new insights to serve the KIC
- State-of-the-art knowledge on the topic
- Knowledge Triangle integration (business, education, research, cultural institutions)

2. Societal& financial impact

- Societal challenges addressed by CCSIs or CCSIs needs linked to societal challenge
- Societal impact
- Financial impact

3. Quality and efficiency of implementation

- Well-structured workplan
- The consortium brings together diverse partners (e.g. size, sector, discipline)
- Budget is clear and justified

8_ Evaluation process





1. Calculation of final scores

- Evaluation: 2 external and 1 internal
- Final score calculated as the arithmetic mean of all scores

2. Thresholds& ranking

- Must pass all thresholds
- Strict ranking order
- Reserve list if budget is exhausted

3. Final ranking

- Selected: Top 8 (1 per STG)
- Reserve list: Eligible but below budget line (valid 1 month)
- Rejected: Did not meet thresholds / too low score

4.Communication of results

- Selected: ESR + next steps letter
- Reserve/Rejected: ESR + final status notification
